Excellent Academic Results

Our collective drive for high standards and consistency has led to impressive outcomes across key measures:



YEAR 1 PHONICS SCREENING:

Trust average of 94%

a strong foundation for early reading success.

EARLY YEARS FOUNDATION STAGE (EYFS):

81% of children achieving a Good Level of Development

showing strong school readiness.

KEY STAGE 2 (AVERAGE ACROSS 3 SCHOOLS):

Excellence in Sport and Enrichment

We're proud to celebrate that **two of our schools have once again been awarded the Platinum Sports Mark** – the highest national award for PE and sport – for the second consecutive year. This recognises our sustained commitment to physical activity, health, and wellbeing.

Additionally, our Year 4 pupils have performed incredibly well in the **national Multiplication Check** – with results more than **double the national average** across all schools.



Enriching Experiences and Community Engagement

School trips have doubled this year, offering our pupils rich, real-world learning opportunities – from cultural visits to residential adventures.

We've also **increased the number of whole community trips**, helping to bring families and schools closer together through shared experiences.

Our **Sports Day** had an abundance of examples of empowering others! All of our children were so encouraging of each other to ensure everyone was 'Striving to be the best!'





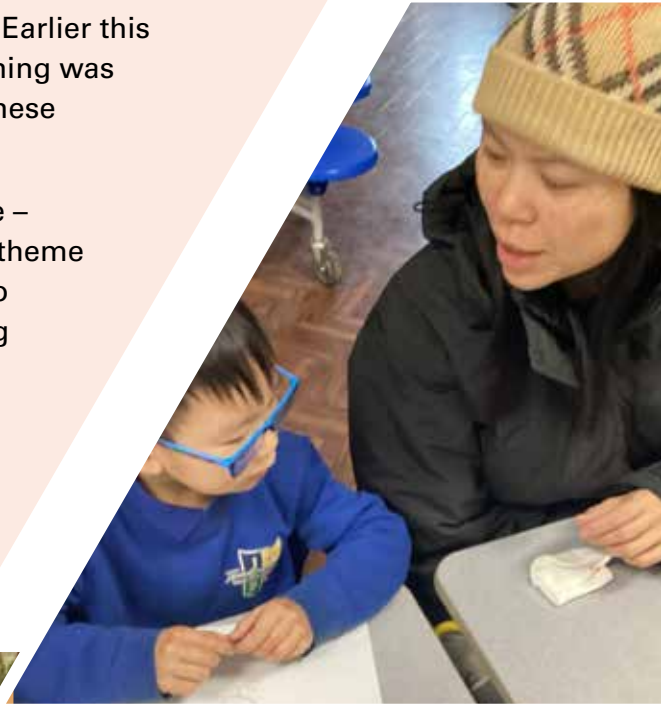

Celebrating Uniqueness

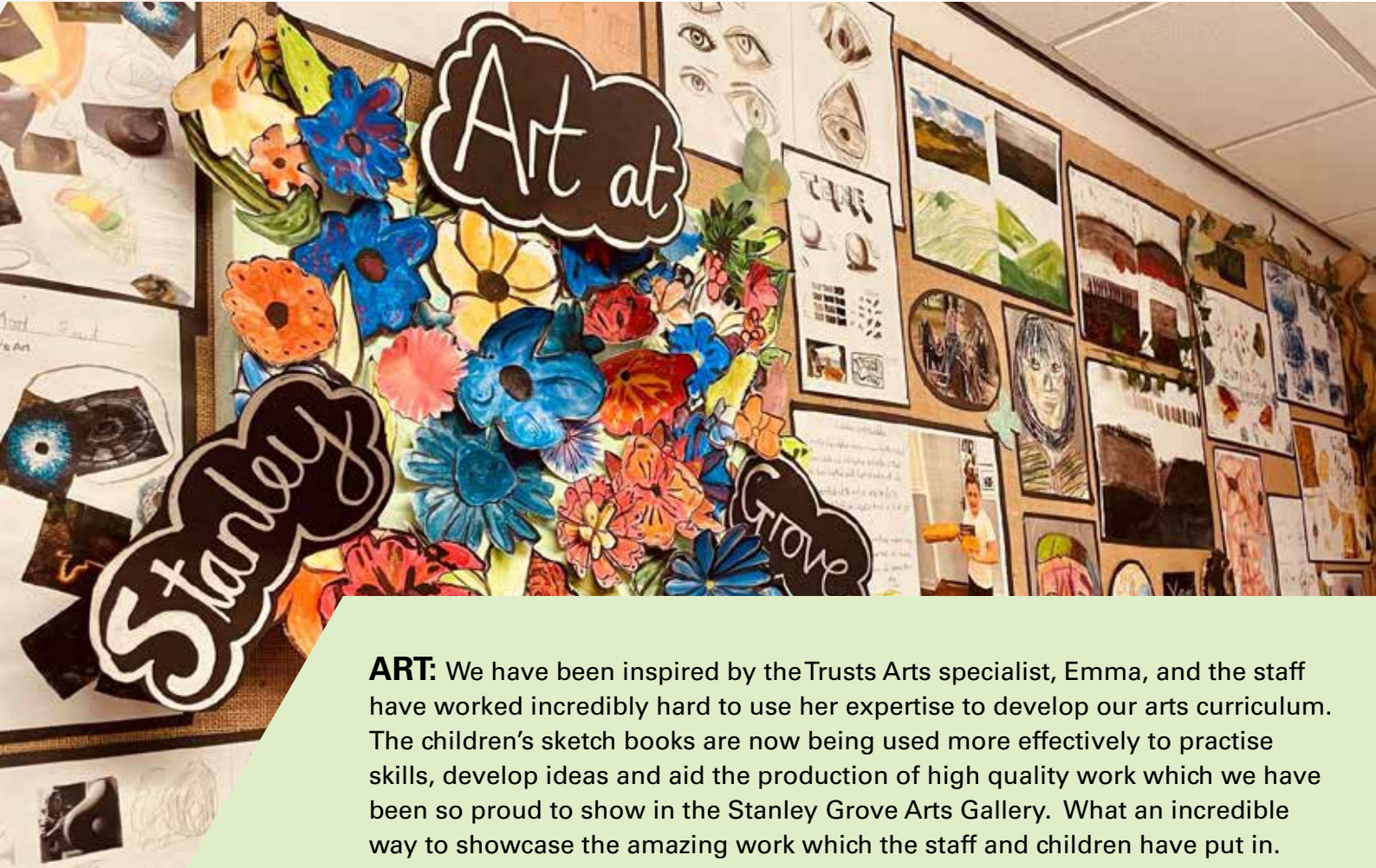

Working to foster a love of reading among our children has yielded remarkable progress, culminating in our highest-ever Phonics Screening Check results. This achievement not only highlights our strengthened teaching practice but also ensures that more pupils have the essential tools they need to become confident readers.



Through targeted professional development and a focus on systematic synthetic phonics (SSP), we have ensured that all children are making good or better progress in their reading skills. This foundational work has been crucial in equipping our pupils with the ability to decode and comprehend texts effectively.

Reading

We have made significant developments to our school's reading culture, encouraging children to develop a genuine love for stories and reading.

- **DEAR Sessions:** Our "Drop Everything and Read" sessions have become a beloved part of our school routine, allowing children to immerse themselves in our beautiful book-nooks across school and share their reading experiences with peers.
- **Book in a Box Assemblies:** Staff-led assemblies where teachers share their favourite children's books have sparked enthusiasm and curiosity among our pupils, inspiring them to explore new titles.
- **Outdoor Reading Shed:** Our outdoor reading shed has provided a unique and inviting space for children to enjoy books in a relaxed environment, promoting reading as a joyful activity.
- **Pupil Reading Ambassadors:** The launch of our Secret Library Club, led by our pupil reading ambassadors, has empowered students to take ownership of their reading journey, fostering peer support and engagement.
- **Parent Engagement Events:** We have successfully hosted several events to engage parents in their children's literacy development. Highlights include our whole school literacy festival and our World Book Day breakfast, both of which have strengthened the home-school partnership and encouraged families to celebrate reading together.
